# THE NBN IS COMING

The National Broadband Network known as the 'NBN' is headed for **Banbury Village!** 

Providing residents a high-speed link between their homes and their service provider, all new homes in stages 11 to 18 at Banbury Village will come ready wired with the necessary NBN Co. equipment for connection to the NBN network.

The balance of the stages within Banbury Village will be serviced by Telstra's existing copper network until such time as NBN Co. deploys fibre-optic cabling in its place. The NBN will initially be used for internet connection and phone calls. with further services such as TV, movies and smart metering etc. potentially becoming available in the future. ### **CONSTRUCTION** UPDATE

Since our last Banbury Village newsletter 24 homes from the Monde and Opus release have settled, which now completes the construction and settlement of detached. semidetached and terrace homes on the western portion of Banbury Village.

Settlement on the townhouses (pictured below) and 23 apartments in the heritage buildings at Banbury Village will be complete by late June.

Works on the remaining heritage building will be completed by the third guarter of 2012, while civil works associated with the final stages of the project for home construction is due for completion in late June.

Construction has now commenced on the homes in the Vesta release.





# WEST FOOTSCRAY RAILWAY STATION UPGRADE

West Footscray is a vibrant and diverse community, with new residential developments altering the suburb's industrial face. An important part of this change will be the new West Footscray railway station being delivered by the Regional Rail Link project. The new station will be built approximately 160 metres west of the existing station and will provide another modern transport hub on the city's western fringe. It will feature:

- A covered pedestrian and cycle overpass connecting Sunshine Road and Cross St
- Stairs, lifts and ramps from the overpass to the station entrances and to all platforms
- Canopies above the station entrances, stairs and platforms
- Station facilities on the overpass, including a ticket office, waiting area and restrooms
- Landscaped forecourt areas on both sides of the station featuring native grass and tree species, seating, greenery and improved lighting
- A new car park on the north side of the station and taxi drop off zones on both sides of the station
- Secure bicycle storage
- Improved pedestrian access to the station, including a crossing on Sunshine Road.

The existing West Footscray railway station will continue to operate throughout construction. Construction of the new station is expected to start in late 2012. For more information visit www.regionalraillink.vic.gov.au.
